## **Diane Darrow - Biography**

Diane Darrow is from the San Francisco Bay Area. She is a former elementary and preschool teacher, art professor, and Information Media Specialist. She began her career as an artist and went on to earn a BFA at Indiana University and then an MFA at the University of Delaware in painting. Her educational training includes Early Childhood (Montessori), Reading Recovery, Masters work in Gifted Education at the University of Connecticut, and an Online Teaching Certificate through CUE's Leading Edge Certification program.

Diane Darrow's teaching career spans 25 years and extends from pre-school, to University level instruction. Her recent work has revolved around integrating iPads with literacy and Project-Based Learning. She is constantly looking for innovative ways to improve the quality of instructions in schools with mobile technology and has written several blog posts for Edutopia ([edutopia.org](http://edutopia.org)) about how apps can promote higher order thinking and creative abilities. She has curriculum design experiences that include a varied selection of teaching methodologies and approaches to instruction.

At both the district and school level, she has helped to design workshops and staff development opportunities that focus on managing and integrating iPads and laptops, as well as virtual and flipped teaching for teachers. She helped to promote a Parent University, which has trained over 500 parents on app use, Mobile learning, and supporting children with technology resources at home. As a teacher at The Nueva School, she developed curriculum that infused IOS technology with the inquiry learning process and instigated iPad use designed to strengthen both creative and critical thinking skills.

Diane has also served on numerous district committees. She served on the Gifted and Talented Task Force, she contributed outlines for a continuum of gifted services for her school district. Included within this continuum were levels of service and enrichment opportunities for all students. She worked with the creators of the app "Toontastic" to create a concise lesson design template for "Launchpad Leaders" and connect content to Common CORE standards.

As one of eight key representatives on her District Technology Committee, Diane worked alongside District Superintendents, Principals, Technology Coordinators and teachers, to reach decisions about future technology adoptions, and the role of technology in curriculum and instruction. Together they discussed a wide range of topics including infrastructure design, staff training opportunities, the integration of iPads, communicating about technology with the parent community, Common Core Standards, and future topics for District Board Meetings. Diane was recently working for the Apple Professional Development team and is dedicated to facilitating a meaningful use of technology that deepens the student learning experience.
